**BC SCHOOL SPORTS & THE LAW**

BCSS AND THE COURTS

I recently spoke on the topic of “BCSS and the Courts” at the Fall Council Meeting in Richmond in October. This article follows the suggestion made by several attendees that the membership might benefit from a summary of that presentation.

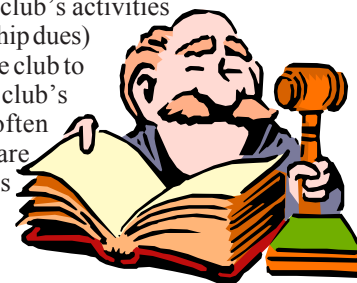
Over the past few years, several members have expressed concern to BCSS about the organization being taken to court. The concern relates to a variety of issues, including the self-regulating nature of BCSS, the perceived incongruity of a student or coach taking his or her own sports organization to court, the high cost to BCSS of defending legal proceedings, and the potential unfairness of students, coaches and schools with financial means going to court when others who may have been the subject of similar rulings are lacking in financial means and are simply unable to afford to do so.

Why do the courts get involved in amateur sports disputes?

This question is a good one coming at a time when the justice system, including the courts, is greatly overburdened. The cases handled by our courts are more numerous and varied than ever, with trials being increasingly complex and taking longer to complete. Access to justice is a very real problem, especially for disadvantaged members of society. It is widely accepted that it takes too long for cases to be heard. Why, then, does our legal system entertain lawsuits centered on amateur sports? Shouldn't sports cases be dealt with by sports organizations themselves and not by the courts?

The answers to these questions are rooted in several decisions of English courts in the 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries in cases involving private social clubs and trade unions. Like those organizations, BCSS is not a government body. It is a private society under the Society Act. Pursuant to the BCSS Constitution, the membership has established a self-regulating regime for interschool sports in B.C.. This regime takes the form of rules including the Competitive Rules and Regulations. The Rules contain both substantive and procedural rules dealing with such matters as student-athlete eligibility, discipline of coaches and student-athletes, and so on.

The English courts recognized that private bodies had their own rules and procedures for making decisions and resolving disputes. They also recognized that the clubs were often better positioned than the courts to resolve disputes that arose in the clubs' affairs. However, the courts, attempting to reconcile clubs' activities with traditional legal concepts, came to view the relationship between clubs and their members as essentially contractual in nature (even if there was no economic aspect to the contract). In other words, the courts perceived the relationship as one where the parties owed each other mutual obligations. For instance, in exchange for participating in the club's activities (and, in some cases, paying membership dues) the member was entitled to expect the club to act lawfully and to comply with the club's rules. Although a contract is often mutually beneficial, the parties are adverse in interest. This



characterization of the relationship provided a theoretical basis for intervention in a dispute between a member and the club since the courts had long been prepared to protect contractual rights.

These early English cases have shaped sports law across Canada. BCSS is not alone; there have been several eligibility and discipline cases across Canada involving private sports bodies, including high school athletics organizations in other provinces, minor and junior hockey associations, community sports bodies, university athletics associations, and even the National Hockey League.

What is the nature of the courts' involvement?

The courts' early intervention was limited. It remains so today. The courts generally take a "hands-off" approach to the operations and internal rulings of private organizations such as BCSS. The courts recognize that these organizations want, and are better able, to interpret and apply their own rules. Consequently, the courts will not rule on substantive issues such as eligibility. For example, in one case involving BCSS, the court refused to substitute its view of "extraordinary circumstances" in an eligibility appeal for that of the Eligibility Appeals Committee.

Additionally, the courts will not intervene if the party has not exhausted internal remedies available within the organization's rules. This restriction is consistent with the view of the courts as an option of "last resort". There is also a public policy component to this approach; the less that ends up in court, the less the impact of these private disputes on the public purse.

However, the courts are prepared to exercise a limited supervisory power over organizations such as BCSS. This power consists of supervising the procedural, as opposed to substantive, aspects of decisions made by BCSS (or its committees). The court may intervene if a decision was made without jurisdiction (e.g., there was no power in the rules to make a particular decision), if a decision maker was biased or there was a reasonable apprehension of bias (e.g., the decision maker had a conflict of interest), if a decision was made in bad faith (e.g., the decision was made on an improper basis, such as racism or a dislike of private schools), or if certain basic procedural fairness rules, known as the rules of natural justice, were not followed (e.g., somebody being disciplined wasn't told of the allegation against him or her and couldn't respond). In such cases, the court may quash or set aside the tribunal's decision and direct that it be reconsidered properly.

However, the case often never gets that far. Many sports cases come before the courts as injunction applications where the court is asked to make a temporary order pending a final determination of the ultimate issue. Such an order might temporarily suspend the effect of a decision on eligibility or discipline, or temporarily order that a student-athlete be allowed to compete.

To succeed on a temporary injunction application, an applicant must generally establish three things: (1) he or she has an arguable case on the ultimate issue; (2) he or she would suffer irreparable harm if the injunction were not granted; and (3) the overall balance of convenience favours the granting of the injunction. Irreparable harm means harm that cannot be compensated for by monetary damages; courts have held that an inability to participate in high school athletics can, in certain circumstances, constitute irreparable harm. Assessing the balance of convenience involves a consideration of all factors, including the interests of third parties such as other schools and athletes.

Most legal cases involving BCSS have been temporary injunction applications. Where a temporary injunction is granted, the court is not making a final determination on the merits of the case. However, it would often be the case that such an order effectively disposes of the entire case, since, by the time the final determination can be made, the particular event or tournament in question has already taken place and the case has become moot. Although the courts have issued temporary injunctions against BCSS in the past, in no case has a court made a final determination against the organization.

Conclusion

Although the courts can get involved in amateur sports cases, that involvement is limited. While some argue bringing the courts into a dispute only serves to aggravate matters and drive up costs, others argue this intervention is good; it encourages proper decision-making and procedural fairness while allowing sports bodies such as BCSS to regulate their own affairs with minimal outside interference.

**BC SCHOOL SPORTS - Outstanding School Award**

In existence since 1989, the BC SCHOOL SPORTS Outstanding School Award is not for the school who has won the most provincial championships, but for those special schools whose commitment to improving the lives of their students and staff through athletics, intramurals, leadership and public service, contribute significantly to the welfare of school athletics in their local community and in B.C. Nominations for the award are self-submitted by Member School.

The perpetual award is a large plaque with a native carving, on display in the BCSS office. The winning school is presented with a gold and royal "Outstanding School Award" banner, for display in their gymnasium or trophy case.

To be eligible, your school must be a BC SCHOOL SPORTS Member School in good standing.

Criteria to be used to rate applicants:

- Extent of extracurricular program;
- Quality and extent of intramural program;
- Staff involvement in coaching and sport administration;
- Participation in various BC SCHOOL SPORTS programs;
- Awards earned, i.e. sportsmanship, individual or team excellence;
- Public Service projects;
- Work done with special populations;
- Fund raising efforts;
- Athletic program's contribution to the school community;
- Special characteristics / activities unique to the school.

**THE APPLICATION - DEADLINE March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2005**

Any staff member in a school may initiate a submission on behalf of a school. The person applying should submit a letter of application and support material stating why the school should be selected (i.e. a maximum of a 3-page letter or 15 minute video). This support material should address the applicable areas as well as any additional information which would be relevant to the selection committee in their deliberations. In addition, there should be a letter from the Principal explaining the place of extracurricular sport and physical activity programs in the school. The letter of application and support material, including Principal's letter, should be received in the BCSS office by **March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2005**

**THE SELECTION PROCESS**

Deadline for submissions is **March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2005**. Submissions postmarked by the deadline will be reviewed and selected by the Management Committee. The successful recipient will be announced at the BC SCHOOL SPORTS Annual General Meeting in May.

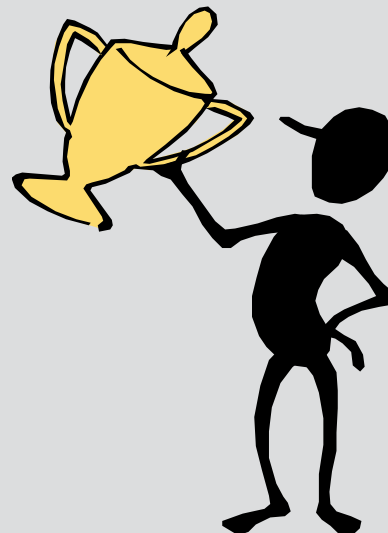
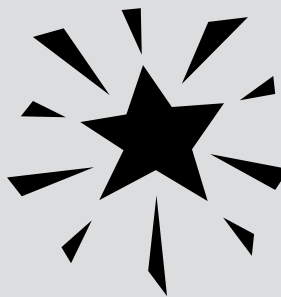

**COMMUNIQUÉ # 3**

To: Principals and Athletic Directors  
From: Brian Lynch, President  
Date: December 15, 2004

As stated in my earlier Communiqués, a Sport Schools/Academies Advisory Group was tasked with defining the concept of sport specific programs in the school system, determining how Resolutions 17A, 17B and 17C would impact upon the delivery of inter-school sport competition, and how our *Competitive Rules and Regulations* might be amended to include such programs.

The Group has now completed its deliberations, with the considerations and recommendations listed below going forward to the meeting of the Board of Directors in January.

The Group recommends that the Resolutions be amended to include the term **Sport Specific Education Program** rather than Sport School. The criteria was included in my previous Communiqué.

Discussion took place on the definition of a 'student athlete', and the Group's recommendation is that for the purposes of BC SCHOOL SPORTS, an athlete be defined as: **A student athlete training to compete for his or her school.**

The group found Resolutions 17A and 17C to be acceptable for the most part, although some members have reservations concerning the inclusion of grade eight and nine students.

Nine out of eleven Group members were unable to support Resolution 17B as it presently stands, finding it unnecessarily restrictive. However, should the Board decide to pursue a path of compromise it could read as follows:

**'Any student athlete transferring into a Sport Specific Education Program is ineligible for all BC SCHOOL SPORTS competition they have competed in during the past twelve months, for a period of twelve months from the date the transfer is physically completed'.**

This amendment was reluctantly supported by eight of the eleven members.

On a related issue, the Advisory Group recommends that BC SCHOOL SPORTS reviews and revises, where appropriate, those sections of its *Competitive Rules and Regulations* with respect to:

- issues related to recruiting;
- eligibility issues, specifically as they relate to student initiated transfers;

- eligibility issues, specifically as they apply to administrative transfers;
- issues related to Provincial Championships, specifically tiering and berthing; and
- any other changes that would need to be made to ensure consistency with our Mission Statement and the direction in which BC SCHOOL SPORTS is headed.

This would be accomplished as part of the implementation of our new Strategic Plan.

It has become evident throughout our discussions that lack of communication has contributed to the misunderstanding surrounding Resolutions 17A, B and C, as well as other critical issues facing the organization. BC SCHOOL SPORTS is committed to keeping clear lines of communication open and developing more effective ways to connect with our partner organizations (BC Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils, BC School Trustees' Association, BC Superintendents' Association and the BC Principals and Vice-Principals' Association). To this end, Sue Keenan presented a proposal with the objective of ensuring that all Member Schools and the key stakeholders internal to the organization are kept fully up-to-date.

Key messages we want heard are:

- Significant changes in recent years have challenged not only our relationship with the Ministry of Education, but also the relevance and applicability of many of our programs and policies.
- Forces behind these challenges have been both internal and external, and have placed us at yet another crossroad in the history of BC SCHOOL SPORTS.
- Challenges also represent opportunities for all key stakeholders to come together with a stronger voice and a unified vision.
- The bottom line is that we want to provide as many opportunities as possible for students to participate in sport.

As President, I would like to express my personal thanks to the members of the Advisory Group for the time and commitment they have given to the task. They came to the table from different perspectives, held widely differing opinions and were not at all hesitant in bringing them forward. Discussion was intense, and at times even heated. While the results will not please everyone, I believe we have made significant progress.

As I mentioned earlier, the considerations and recommendations outlined above will be discussed by the Board of Directors next month, and their decisions will form the basis of resolutions going forward to the Annual General Meeting in May. However, in the end, it will be the Member schools that make the final decisions, not the Board. It is important to understand that Member schools represent coaches, Athletic Directors, school administrators, Superintendents, Trustees and ultimately the parents who are the schools' clients. I would urge you to ensure that before your school exercises its vote at the Annual General Meeting, there has been opportunity for meaningful input from all of these stakeholders.

Dear Colleague

My name is Greg Smyth and I am Principal at Alberni District Secondary School. I am writing to you in my capacity as the elected Administrators' Representative on the BC SCHOOL SPORTS Board of Directors. Welcome to another new, exciting and hopefully rewarding year.

As I'm sure you are aware, membership in BCSS is voluntary, but the Principal of a Member School is responsible to ensure that the Athletic Directors and coaches understand and comply with BCSS rules and regulations. Understanding all the work that goes into the start of another new school year and the time crunch that we all face, I would still strongly encourage all administrators to review and become familiar with the BCSS programs and policies. Most policy violations committed by member schools or teams could have been prevented if the coaches involved had a working understanding of the BCSS competitive rules and regulations.

I urge you to make sure that your school exercises its rights by attending local Athletic Association league meetings, responding to mail votes from Sport Commissions and having your coaches attend Commission General Meetings, providing input and feedback to surveys and questionnaires, voicing concerns to Zone Representatives, and being present in person or by proxy at the BCSS Annual General Meeting held in May each year. Representatives of BCSS Member Schools have approved every one of the various policies, rules and regulations and bylaws that you will read in the Handbook.

**The Administrators' Committee will most likely meet on October 23** in Richmond, BC. The Administrators' Committee's role is to take the ideas and concerns brought to our attention from Administrators across the province, formulate feedback, and forward recommendations to the Board of Directors and membership. These recommendations are seriously considered and in the past few years have been instrumental in making positive revisions concerning the eligibility and disciplinary policies of the association.

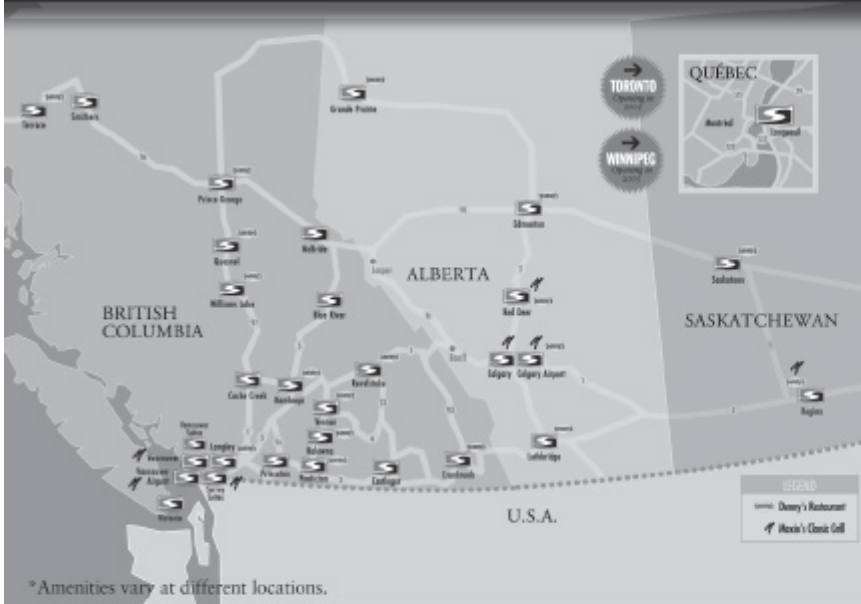


