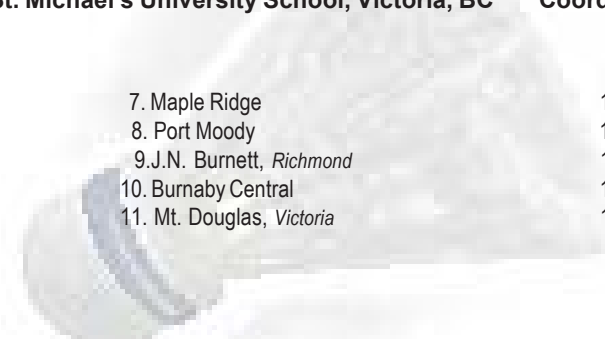

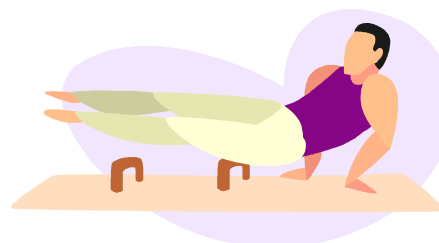

THE NCCP SCHOOL COACH CERTIFICATION INITIATIVE

(NCCP Competition – Introduction Courses for School Coaches)**INTRODUCTION:**

- Discussions involving the Canadian School Sport Federation (CSSF) and the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC) have identified several needs:
 - ◊ to increase delivery of the NCCP to public school coaches,
 - ◊ to adjust delivery based on the background of the school coaches, which include:
 - teacher-coaches who have physical education backgrounds and who should be fast-tracked through the certification process
 - teachers without physical education backgrounds and who should also receive accelerated certification, but not to the same degree as those with physical education degrees
 - school coaches who are not teachers and who should be subject to the usual delivery process
 - ◊ To adapt the NCCP content for school use. This might include, but is not limited to, additional material about school philosophy and other school-specific matters. It is generally agreed that adaptations should not alter significantly the integrity of the NCCP program.
- CAC, in collaboration with the CSSF and a number of National Sport Federations (NSF's), is embarking on this project and proposes to use the Competition – Introduction context as the platform.
- For this first round, the participating NSF's will be:
 - ◊ four sports which are significant parts of the schools' sports programs
 - ◊ far enough advanced in the transition from the old to the new NCCP to allow them to participate in this project
 - ◊ are tending toward integrated delivery models. (This does not imply restriction of the initiative to those sports with integrated delivery. The longer range objective is to include all relevant sports.)

- Limited discussions have also begun with the independent schools in order to include them in this initiative. It is unclear at this point whether they will require separate treatment or if their needs can be met by collaborating in this present work.
- One very important aim of this initiative is to forge long-term working partnerships and communication between CAC, the NSF's, and the CSSF. Additionally, and equally important, is the need to foster enduring relationships at the provincial/territorial level between the Provincial/Territorial Coaching Coordinators (P/TCC's), the Provincial/Territorial Sport Organizations (P/TSO's), and the Provincial School Sport Federations (Pass's). This will ensure the following outcomes:
 - ◊ Collaboration in identifying and training a pool of new Learning Facilitators (LF's) for this program. Ideally, the new LF's who run this program should be teacher-LF's with expertise in the relevant sports.
 - ◊ Enhanced and enduring communication between these provincial/territorial partners.
 - ◊ Enduring ability to deliver this program in the schools. The new teacher-LF's identified as part of this undertaking may play an important role in solving some of the rural delivery challenges, especially if those rural areas are targeted for LF talent identification by the CSSF and P/TCC's. Additionally, an expanded pool of new "rural" teacher-LF's may have added value for P/TCC's in delivering courses outside the school system.
 - ◊ Enhanced participation in the NCCP by school federations and school coaches in the public (and private?) schools.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT:

- CAC is proposing that the Competition – Introduction program context is used as the template for the project. Some questions about this proposal will need answers; for example:
 - ◊ Is Competition – Introduction the only choice? Could that program be used to certify teacher-coaches, and could the Community Sport – Initiation be used for non-teachers?
 - ◊ Could the multi-sport program be modified and used? This may be particularly helpful for

those coaches in school sports that will not feature integrated programs.

- CAC has begun to identify key NSF's (sports) which are far enough advanced in writing their integrated Competition – Introduction programs to engage in this work. As of February 1, these include basketball, volleyball, wrestling, and possibly athletics. Other sports may be identified in discussions involving CAC consultants with their respective NSF's.
- CAC will establish four working groups of four members to complete the work on each sport program. As stated earlier, this work will involve some modification of content and delivery.
- Each working group will include one representative from the relevant NSF and three school teachers who are also LF's for the context and sport. **These people are to be identified through a national search and nomination process involving PSSF members and their local P/TCC's, who – by way of this message – are**

being asked to collaborate in identifying relevant persons in their respective provinces/territories. (Please ensure that your nominee will serve, and forward the name to G. Ness at the address below by February 28, 2005)

- The progress of the working groups will be monitored to ensure that all PSSF needs are accommodated, and to ensure consistency, and to avoid duplication.
- The working groups should be struck by March 1, 2005 and should be given two tasks:
 - ◊ To complete the adaptation to the content and delivery systems to the satisfaction of CAC, the NSF's, and the CSSF/PSSF's.
 - ◊ To develop plans for piloting the content and delivery of the School Coach Certification courses in various provinces and territories across Canada beginning September 2005

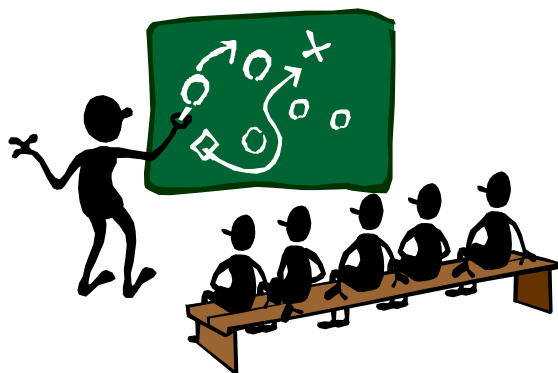
