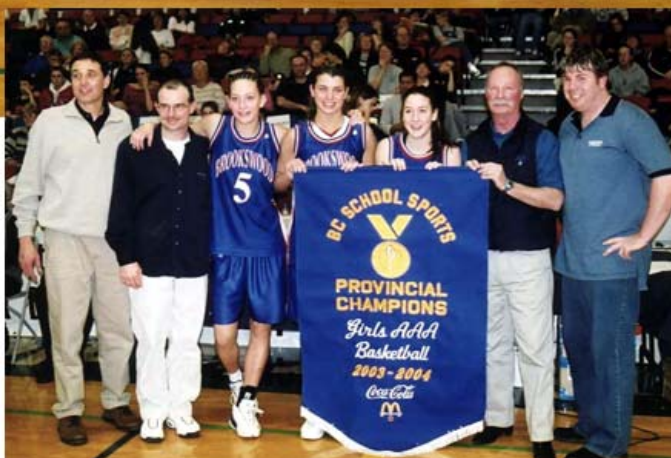

### Executive Director's Reflections

With the permission of my colleague in Ontario, Mr. Colin Hood, I have taken the liberty of including this piece in this edition of the BCSS Report magazine. I believe that the content is timely and perhaps it would be beneficial for all of us to reflect on the true spirit of school sports.

"It has been a tough time for some sport governing bodies in Canada as they are confronted by an increasing number of violent incidents and legal cases surrounding parental expectations of young athletes. I believe that, for a small minority, the result of games has become too important and the rewards for sport achievement have become the primary reason to participate in sport. The educational values that we in school sport hold so dearly are being ignored or forgotten as the quest for a victory, scholarship, or an MVP designation become the critical factors of a small minority of coaches, parents and athletes.

We in school sport must not become complacent about defending educational values in school sport. As pressures increase on all of us to change our programs to reflect the changes in Canadian society we must guard against our programs becoming mired in the same controversies and becoming beset by the actions of a few individuals who believe that school programs are only there to showcase individual high school "stars". The signs are there that unless we continue to uphold the educational values and be true to our principles we will not only have the same problems, but our programs will change so that the differences between sport for school aged children and school sport will be minimized.

The number of calls from parents complaining about the local and provincial rules for school sport has increased significantly over the past number of years. The focus of these calls has nearly always been on athletes who have developed their skills and who train largely outside the school system. BCSS, in some ways, is the architect of its own problems. Our events are well run, enormously successful, well publicized and do attract recruiters from Canadian and U.S. Universities. The motive for participating has for some become more to do with showcasing their talent at our events than with the fun and enjoyment and learning experiences that school sport provides.

**Participation on a school team is still a privilege and not a right.**

The other area which I wish to address at this time, is the conduct of fans at school events. When schools win a BCSS Championship it is a huge achievement and one that has been done with a commitment from school administration, parents, fans, etc. Winning a BCSS banner is a big event and once again BCSS has to be careful in not making the victory too significant in the overall educational experience associated in a student's life. It is evident that fan and athlete behavior can get caught up in the moment and unless we are vigilant, actions

occur that are detrimental to our programs. We have to continue to stress the importance of winning and losing gracefully and make it clear to all that we will not tolerate bad behavior. Sports teams accept this is not easy given the exposure that the media gives and accepts for intolerant behavior. Lastly, I think we need to look to alternate strategies for dealing with unruly fans that have problems accepting officials and coaching decisions at the games. It is no longer acceptable just to have a code of behavior; we must act. I noticed a recent article from the U.S. in which high school fans who contravene acceptable codes of behavior are issued a yellow card. The interesting thing about this card is the message on it is from students. It reads, "It's not your game, it's ours... We hope the spectators will watch, enjoy, encourage and be proud of us, win or lose. We need your support and enthusiasm, not your yelling and criticism. Be a fan not a fanatic".

If we hold true to our values then school sport will be around to help educate students for many years to come. "

**COACHES' CORNER****PRINCIPALLY SPEAKING**

For the past several years after school, in the evenings and on weekends, I have had the pleasure of watching my daughters participate in their chosen sports. Their skill and character development has been amazing and their coaches deserve tremendous credit. Several years ago when we started our youngsters in sports, all the parents seemed to have the same goals for their kids – let the little tykes run around to get exercise, develop some skills and have fun. All the parents were happy, the coaches were appreciated and the referees were respected.

Unfortunately somewhere between the tykes and teens, the goals and behaviours have changed – for the worse. I am not talking about the behaviour of the athletes but rather that of some parents. The intensity of some parents, the bad mouthing of referees, and the criticizing of coaches is sometimes too much. In fact, some parents are so embarrassed by the adult behaviour in the stands that they separate themselves from the group.

This negative parent spectator behaviour has become so prevalent across the country that there are now T.V. and radio commercials sponsored by Hockey Canada trying to educate parents on how ridiculous they look and sound. In our school district this has been discussed at coaches meetings and the following statement was drafted to be read over a loud speaker by coaches or athletic directors prior to games or tournaments:

*“The Coquitlam Middle School Athletic Association (CMSAA) believes in the development of skills through a variety of activities with an emphasis on fair play and equity of participation. It is our expectation that all students, coaches, spectators and officials conduct themselves in a manner that is polite, respectful, encouraging and supportive.”*

It seems very unfortunate that we need to read such a statement at a middle school sporting event. Have we forgotten what sport is all about? Have we forgotten that those goals we had for our little tykes should be the same ones for our teens? As our young athletes mature, three other goals that should be adopted are positive character development, commitment, and sportsmanship. These are best learned by role modeling and we are the number one role models in our children's lives.

So, this weekend and in the future, if you are at the rink, on the pitch, or in the bleachers, please remember these things and remind other parents as well:

1. Referees are human. If your players make as few mistakes as refs do, every game will be a victory.
2. Coaches are giving up a lot of their personal time. Appreciate that and support their coaching decisions.
3. Cheer a good play ... for either team.
4. Always remain encouraging, respectful and positive.
5. Relax ... it is only a game!
