BC SCHOOL SPORTS AWARDS PROGRAM

Overall Purpose

To recognize colleagues and schools who have made a significant contribution to athletic programs within the secondary school system in British Columbia.

BC SCHOOL SPORTS OUTSTANDING SCHOOL AWARD

Purpose

To recognize **one school at both the Junior/Senior Secondary level and middle school level** whose special commitment to improving the lives of its students and staff through athletics, intramurals, leadership and public service has contributed significantly to the welfare of school athletics in its local community and within the province.

Form

The perpetual award is a large plaque, with a native carving, on display in the BCSS office. The winning **schools** are presented with a gold and royal blue *Outstanding School Award* banner.

Eligibility Criteria

Nominees must be a BC SCHOOL SPORTS Member School in good standing.

Additional criteria to be used in evaluating nominated schools:

- Extent of extracurricular program;
- Quality and extent of intramural program;
- Staff involvement in coaching and sport administration;
- Participation in various BCSS programs;
- Awards earned, i.e. sportsmanship, individual or team excellence;
- Public service projects;
- Work done with special populations;
- Fund raising projects;
- Athletic program's contribution to the school community;
- Special characteristics/activities unique to the school.

Nomination Procedure

Any staff member in a school may initiate a nomination on behalf of a school. The person nominating should submit the completed form and supporting documentation stating why the school should be selected (i.e. a maximum of a three page letter). This letter should address the applicable areas as well as any additional information which would be relevant to an Awards Committee in its deliberations. In addition, there should be a letter from the school principal explaining the place of extracurricular sport and physical activity programs in the school.

Selection Procedure

Deadline for receipt of nominations at the BCSS office is March 1 of the current school year. Selection of the successful candidate schools will be made by an Awards Committee no later than April 1 of the current school year.

NEW FOR 2005-2006 is 2 categories for this award:

Category A – Junior or Secondary Schools

Category B – Middle Schools

BC SCHOOL SPORTS HONOUR AWARD

Form

The award consists of a large framed certificate with the recipient's name as well as a special *Honour Award Pin*. The recipient also receives a *Gold Card* which entitles him/her, together with a guest, to attend any BCSS Provincial Championship (except Boys' Basketball). The recipient's name is engraved on a permanent plaque, which is displayed in the BCSS office. This award is limited to **two** recipients each year.

AWARDS PROGRAM . . . *cont'd*

Eligibility Criteria

- Must have been involved as a coach/sponsor at the school level.
- Must have served administratively on at least **two** of the following:
Executive of a Local Association;
Executive of a Sport Commission; or
Member of a Standing Committee.
- Must have served at least **one full two-year term** as a member of the BCSS Board of Directors.
- Must be or have been a teacher or administrator.
- Must not currently be a member of the BCSS Board of Directors.

Selection Procedure

Deadline for receipt of nominations is March 1 of the current school year. Selection of the successful candidate(s) will be made by an Awards Committee no later than April 1 of the current school year.

BC SCHOOL SPORTS MERIT AWARD

Form

The award consists of a plaque engraved with the recipient's name. This award is limited to six recipients each year.

Eligibility Criteria

- Must have been involved as a **coach/sponsor, administrator, or official** at the school level.
- Must have served administratively on at least **one** of the following:
Executive of a Local Association;
Executive of a Sport Commission;
Member of a Standing Committee; or
Member of the BCSS Board of Directors.
- Must be or have been a teacher or administrator.
- Must not currently be a member of the BCSS Board of Directors.

Selection Procedure

Deadline for receipt of nominations is March 1 of the current school year. Selection of the successful candidate(s) will be made by an Awards Committee no later than April 1 of the current school year.

BC SCHOOL SPORTS RECOGNITION AWARD

Form

This **school based** award consists of a formal certificate with the recipient's name and is available to both a female and male school coach.

Eligibility Criteria

Criteria may include, but not be limited to:

- Service and/or leadership as coach
- Organization of an event that has had a significant impact;
- Success of a particular team or activity.

The contribution being recognized should have occurred within the most recent school year period.

Selection Procedure

Each member school is invited to **select one male and female recipient** and forward his/her name to the BCSS office no later than June 1 of the current school year.

COURT DISMISSES COACH'S LAWSUIT AGAINST BC SCHOOL SPORTS

In June of 2004 a formal Coach's Code of Conduct complaint was received by BC SCHOOL SPORTS alleging violations of the Coach's Code of Conduct by Larry Street, Teacher/Coach at G.P. Vanier Secondary.

Over the course of the 2004-2005 school year this complaint was addressed by two voluntary hearing panels in accordance with policies 8.4.2 and 8.5.4 as outlined in the BCSS Handbook and Directory.

As a result of a hearing conducted by a Panel of the Disciplinary Committee, Mr. Street was suspended from coaching until the end of the 2004-2005 Basketball season. The suspension was upheld by an Appeal Panel. Mr. Street was found to have violated Rule 2.1.9 of the BCSS Competitive Rules.

Mr. Street started a lawsuit against BCSS in BC Supreme Court, seeking to quash the suspension. Soon after filing his lawsuit, Mr. Street applied for a temporary injunction allowing him to coach until his lawsuit was heard. BCSS opposed the application in court. The temporary injunction was granted and as a result, Mr. Street was able to coach until the end of the season.

On July 6, 2005, Mr. Justice Silverman, who heard the case in Supreme Court issued his judgment. Outlined below is a summary of that decision:

- 1) The Court found that BCSS's handling of this matter was "fundamentally fair". Accordingly, Mr. Street's action was dismissed.
- 2) On a preliminary issue the court ruled that organizations like BCSS cannot use "privative" or restrictive clauses in their internal rules to eliminate the rights of parties such as coaches to sue as a result of disciplinary hearings.
- 3) The Court declined to award court costs against Mr. Street.

Although BC SCHOOL SPORTS won this case the financial cost on the organization was substantial. As a result all 400 member schools have been assessed an additional surcharge for those costs incurred with their 2005-2006 membership dues. BC SCHOOL SPORTS continues to be committed to ethics in interscholastic sport competition and to ensuring that all school coaches adhere to the competitive rules and regulations as developed and approved by all member schools. In order to maintain a level and fair playing field our Coaches will need to continue to lead by example both on and off the courts.
