BC High School Track & Field Commission AGM

12:15pm Meeting brought to order.

Presentation of the financial statements.

The BC Multi-Event Championships lose significant money annually, but with addition of gr. 8 & junior divisions the event deficit is cut down by approximately 50% in 2015. Commissioner stated that he believed the event would break even in 2016.

The commission in a strong financial position, moving into the 2015-16 year with a surplus of more than \$25,000 likely. Commissioner wanting to increase the reserve operating fund to \$50,000 over the coming years to cover pre-championship expenses.

Noted that championship entry fees have decreased per participant from previous years, that cap was set for total fees paid by any school at \$1200. In addition Gaming money from BCSS used to support travel expenses by Northwest, Northcentral, Kootenays, & Vancouver Island Zones totalling \$2500.

Commissioner expressed concern that commission needs to diversify revenue sources in coming years, and is heavily reliant on Subway sponsorship & championship entry fees revenue.

Tiering Motion by Tom Turnbull, Lambrick Park.

Proposal-Motion

To implement 3 tiers (A, AA, AAA) for Provincial Championships in Track & Field.

Rationale

- a) Presently, most high school sports in B.C. have at least 2-4 tiers.
- b) At least 5 Provinces (with populations less than B.C.) have 3 4 tiers for their Provincial T&F Championships.
- c) The structure of the meet does not have to change (Only the scoring system).
- d) Opportunity for smaller schools to win a Provincial T&F Championship.

<u>Details</u>

- a) B.C. School Sports with more than 1 tier:
 - Basketball-Boys (4)
 - Volleyball-Girls (4)
 - Basketball-Girls (3)
 - Volleyball-Boys (3)
 - Golf (3)
 - Soccer-Boys (3)
 - Soccer-Girls (3)

- Football (2)
- Rugby (2)
- Tennis (2)
- b) Provinces smaller than B.C. with multiple tiers in Track & Field Provincial Championships:

* B.C. Population 4.5 Million (1 Tier)
Alberta 4.0 Million (4 Tiers)
Manitoba 1.3 Million (4 Tiers)
Saskatchewan 1.1 Million (4 Tiers)
Nova Scotia 950,000 (4 Tiers)
New Brunswick 750,000 (3 Tiers)

- c) Having Tiers will not change the structure or integrity of the meet.
 - The qualifying remains the same.
 - The best still compete against the best of all tiers.
- * The only difference is separating schools into their proper Tiers for team scoring (Boys, Girls and Aggregate).

- 12. Maroon High School (2A) 35 pts.

Suggested & agreed that tiering would be implemented in 2016 & reviewed. Tom to follow up with official request to the BC Championship Standards Committee to request tiering be allowed at BC Track & Field Championship.

Motion voted on & passed.
