## **Berthing Process (Boys)**

There are 16 berths into each of the 4 Provincial Championships. Each zone champion (9 zones) is awarded a berth to the 2023 Provincial Championship.

The seven (7) remaining or 'at large' berths are distributed to the zones with the greatest proportion of teams in their zone relative to the total teams throughout the province in that tier. The final berthing allocations are as follows:

\*Wild card game between #3 teams will determine the final entry into 4A tournament.

BC School Sports does not favour the use of wild card or challenge games to determine entries into the provincial championships. There has been a variety of different formats used in the past, and in the absence of written policy, BCSS will permit the use of a wild card game in the AAAA Tier for the 2023 Championships. The wild card game will be contested by the 3<sup>rd</sup> place teams from the Fraser North and Vancouver Sea-to-Sky zones with the winner of the game to advance to the 'AAAA' Provincial Championships. The game will take place at a neutral pre-arranged site.

The basketball SACs and tournament organizing committees will be enlisted to develop a tiebreaking policy which will be presented at the 2023 Fall Planning Meeting for ratification by the Legislative Assembly and implementation for the 2023-24 basketball season.

# Seeding Committees (Boys)

The ranking committees will meet on the Sunday before the provincial championships to seed the championship bracket. The final seeding will be published shortly thereafter.

## Boys Meeting: March 5<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Zone playdowns should be completed by February 26<sup>th</sup>.

The following factors are used by the committees to determine final seeding (All may be given equal consideration):

- Teams from the same zone shall not play against each other in the first round unless this is not possible on the numbers of berths.
  - If teams must be adjusted to avoid first round matchups it is preferential that teams be adjusted in lower seeds rather than higher seeds. E.g., move a team from 14<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> or 13<sup>th</sup> to avoid playing the first round against a team from their zone rather than moving a team from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup>
- Order of finish in zone tournaments. It is preferential (but not mandatory) that teams are ranked in order of their zone tournament placing.
- Zone champions will receive highest rank compared to other teams from their zone.
- Head-to-head competition between teams if they have played against each other will also be considered
  - More weight will be given to more recent games.

## **Berthing Process (Girls)**

There are 16 berths into each of the 4 Provincial Championships.

- Each zone champion (9 zones) is awarded a berth.
- Two berths are awarded to the zones with the highest team registrations.
- 'A' awards one berth to the host school of the 'A' Provincials.
- Remaining four or five berths (dependent on the tier) are considered 'at large' berths and awarded by the Berthing/Seeding Committee for each tier.
- If a zone does not have any registered teams in a specific tier, their zone champion berth will be reallocated into the 'at large' berth pool.
- Berthing committees will meet and award 'at large' berths no later than Feb 6<sup>th</sup>.

# Seeding Committees (Girls)

The ranking committees will meet on the Sunday before the provincial championships to seed the championship bracket. The final seeding will be published shortly thereafter.

### Girls Meeting: February 26<sup>th</sup>. Zone playdowns should be completed by February 19<sup>th</sup>.

The following factors are used by the committees to determine final seeding (All may be given equal consideration):

- Teams from the same zone shall not play against each other in the first round unless this is not possible on the numbers of berths.
  - If teams must be adjusted to avoid first round matchups it is preferential that teams be adjusted in lower seeds rather than higher seeds. E.g., move a team from 14<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> or 13<sup>th</sup> to avoid playing the first round against a team from their zone rather than moving a team from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup>
