END OF YEAR MESSAGE

And just like that, the spring season, along with the 2022-2023 year, has come to a close. What a great finish it was with some incredible spring season championships, culminating in 14 incredible BCSS championships over 17 days across the province. We had our largest ever mountain biking championship field ever with nearly 500 participants on Red Mountain in Rossland, as that sport continues to grow. Our rugby championship, the largest rugby event in Canada, with 88 teams, 143 coaches and 2196 student-athletes was a great event featuring boys, girls, 15-a-side and 7-a-side competition. The following weekend saw the BCSS Track and Field Championships, with a record 2447 competitors and 628 coaches participating at the event and saw some incredible performances with multiple all-time records broken.

We know that making a provincial championship is the pinnacle for any student-athlete in their high school sporting career, and many come to recognize it as one of the highlights of their formative years. It would not be possible to put these events on without the incredible support of the many volunteers, officials and coaches who make them happen. Thank you to everyone who had a role in creating these events, and opportunities for our student-athletes.

I want to extend a special thank you to the athletic directors at our 450+ member schools. This thankless and demanding role is the most critical to any athletics program, and despite the challenges and in many cases the lack of adequate support, our ADs go above and beyond to ensure the students in their schools can participate and experience the benefits of school sports. There is no way we could properly salute them, but we do want to publicly say thanks to all our athletic directors for a great year and the countless hours you have put in to make it happen.

Part of the reason that the demands were so high this year is because we saw a massive increase in participation rates. Overall, we saw an 8.3% increase from last year, which was already an increase from pre-covid numbers. Across the province, we had 117,608 sport registrations this year. We are checking historical records, but this will be close to, if not, a 10-year high in total participation.

Thank you to everyone for your efforts this year. It was wonderful to see school sport so robust and rebound so strongly after years of pandemic setbacks. A reminder that the office is open Monday to Thursday throughout the summer. I wish all of you a restful and relaxing summer, and we look forward to seeing you in the fall.
