END OF YEAR MESSAGE

We made it! What a year it has been, and I know everyone is excited for a break. Please take a moment to find enclosed some important information both on wrapping up this year, and some dates to set the stage for next year.

Let me begin by expressing my thanks to everyone who was involved in school sport this year. It was unlike anything we've experienced before. Starting with a very tough fall season, after 17 months with no school sport. We had an unprecedented number of new Athletic Directors, who were trying to get programs up and running with no momentum from the previous year. From mid-September through late October, BCSS was receiving over 1000 emails and phone calls a day and we really tried to provide the support to help everyone get things moving again. Things started to ease in late October, but it wasn't long before the storm and flooding and highway washouts in the middle of the Fall Championship season. We had to pivot to new regional style events in some sports, while in others we changed hosts, and moved dates on little notice. It's never a good situation to be in when there are no good options, but our Board of Directors and staff spent countless hours working through the issues and tried to find the outcomes that were best, given the undesirable circumstances. We thank everyone for their understanding and support through this period, especially those that stepped up to onboard large events to find a way to make sure kids had these experiences.

Finally, we arrived at our Spring season, which hadn't been active in 32 months. It was once again a huge lift for our schools and the leadership to get these programs back online. As usual, our member school admin, athletic directors and coaches did amazing work to restart these programs after an extended and unparalleled dormancy. Through all these challenges we were adapting to an entirely new governance structure, and our spring sports hadn't even had a chance to compete with the 9-zone structure adopted in Spring of 2018. I can't express my gratitude and amazement at the efforts of everyone involved in driving school sport. It was the hardest of years, and yet, every sport happened, every obstacle thrown at us was overcome all with the mindset and determination of providing those opportunities for kids.

And opportunities we did provide! There were incredible stories and highlights throughout the year. We saw some incredible displays of sportsmanship, some incredible athletic performances, and tremendous resilience in the face of huge adversity. Ultimately core memories were created for thousands of young people that will stay with them and shape them as they move forward with their lives.

And now, you have all earned a much-needed rest. From government partners, district administrators, school administrators, athletic directors, and coaches, I thank you for your support, and enormous efforts you each made to make this year possible. I hope your summer is restful and restorative. I hope you return in September to a much more normal year where BCSS can continue to serve you, our member schools and provide opportunities for our student-athletes. See you in September.


