First Aid Protocol

An Athletic Therapist will be in attendance during this event. Ice will be available at all fields. All teams are responsible for their own tape and supplies.

In accordance with FIH regulations, the umpires will assess the injury and ask for help if needed. In case of minor injuries, the umpires may wave the coach onto the field. Coaches are not to enter the field of play, until waved on. For more significant injuries, especially those to the head, the umpires will ask for the Athletic Therapist. In either circumstance, the player must remain on the sidelines for at least 2 minutes after the resumption of play.

Ambulances are to be called by the Athletic Therapist/First Aid Person only. For injuries that do not require an ambulance but do need extra medical attention, Duncan General Hospital is within 20 minutes of the Shawnigan Lake School fields and 5mins from the Cowichan Sportplex. Directions will be provided as part of the coaches' technical information package. The tournament committee DOES NOT have a vehicle to transport players to hospital.

Code of Conduct

All players, coaches, team officials and parents are expected to abide by the BCSS Code of Conduct at all times.
