



Below is a summary of motions voted on at the 2026 Annual General Meeting. We have provided the outcome and a brief summary of the motion. Note that all carried motions come into effect on August 1, 2026 for the next school year unless otherwise stated. To view the complete motions as presented in the [AGM package 2](#).

Motion #	Resolution	Motion Brought Forward By:	Outcome
1	Bylaw 7.4 – Board Composition	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
Remove the requirement that at least one of the three Section Representative positions must be held by a female director, and instead stipulate that the Board must be composed of a minimum of two male and two female directors at all times. To provide more flexibility, while still maintaining gender diversity.			
2	Fee Schedule – Legal Contingency Fund	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
To balance the legal fund through a legal levy over the next two years to ensure BC School Sports has sufficient funds to defend a legal case should it be required.			
3	Motions being brought forward by Zones	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
To clarify how Zones can submit a Notice of Motion through their Legislative Assembly for consideration at a General or Special Meeting of the Legislative Assembly.			
4	BCSS Calendar	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
To make it easier for schools and stakeholders to predict calendar dates and reduce the likelihood of errors when building out the calendars, the week count for the BCSS activity calendar will start on Labour Day.			
5	Scholarship Committee	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
To amend the language around this policy to ensure it aligns with current scholarship offerings. Students in zones without a representative in the Scholarship Committee are now eligible for scholarships.			

6	Use of Drones Over Field of Play	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
Clarifies the expectations around the use of drones at BCSS events.			
7	Legacy Fund	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
To increase awareness amongst students of the Legacy Fund by requiring every student-athlete who competes in a BCSS Provincial Championship to pay a fee of \$1.00 which will be invested in the fund. Funds collected through this fee will be designated for long-term investment to help reduce costs and support school sport in the future.			
8	Provincial Championship Calendar	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
To amend the calendar to clarify when Championship weeks will be many years in advance and how the process for changes functions, as well as to provide consistency on the length of each season of play for each sport.			
9	Returning Exchange Student-Athlete	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
To apply a change in procedure, instead these applications will now go to appeal. This is done to reduce legal liability and eliminate an infrequently used policy.			
10	Badminton – Singles Player Order Based on Strength	Spring Rules Committee	CARRIED.
This motion to be implemented immediately. To change match order to align. In all ties, schools are required to assign their stronger of the two singles players to the Singles “A” position to ensure competitive integrity and equitable match play.			
11	Badminton – Tiebreaker Policy	Spring Sports Rules Committee	CARRIED.
To ensure current tiebreaker policy is available for reference in the BCSS Handbook. If two teams are tied, the head to head record will be used. If more than two teams are tied a criteria is used in sequential order as laid out in the policy.			
12	Molten – Official Game Ball for Soccer, Volleyball & Basketball	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
To ensure that all sanctioned competition will use the same ball as outlined for the sport of Soccer, Volleyball, and Basketball. After transition period the policy is being strengthened to ensure understanding for all member schools, and consistency to ensure equity by standardizing the game ball.			
13	Tennis – Singles Player Order Based on Strength	Spring Sports Rules Committee	CARRIED.

This motion to be implemented immediately. This clearly articulates the process that coaches need to follow when submitting the lineup sheet prior to each match to ensure competitive integrity and equitable match play.			
14	Ultimate – Provincial Championship Week	Team Championship Committee	CARRIED.
To move this year’s provincial championship to week 39 so league schedules and zone championships can be completed in time.			
15	Wrestling – Housekeeping	Winter Sports Rules Committee	CARRIED.
Housekeeping for Wrestling Policy to ensure that common practice is reflected in policy.			
16	Girls Basketball – Tiering Numbers	Vancouver Sea-to-Sky Zone	DEFEATED.
To equally distribute the number of teams across the four tiers of Girls Basketball.			
17	Mountain Biking – Enduro Helmet Rule	Thompson-Okanagan Zone	CARRIED.
To align BCSS with current national and international Enduro safety standards regarding helmet requirements. Clarifies discipline-specific expectations, improves safety and ensures helmets are always worn correctly.			
18	Golf – Berthing	Vancouver Sea-to-Sky Zone	DEFEATED.
To expand access to the BC Golf Championships by allowing the top three golfers from each zone to qualify.			
19	Girls Volleyball – Provincial Championships Date Change	Vancouver Sea-to-Sky Zone	DEFEATED.
To move Girls Volleyball Provincial Championship up by one week.			
20	Video and Streaming	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
Provides clarity for member schools, district administrators, and the general public about the public nature of interscholastic contests, where there are limitations on public access and what is permitted with regards to recording and digital distribution.			
21	Football Policy Section	Board of Directors	CARRIED.
This policy change is updating the football section for simplicity to ensure more clarity for football coaches and ADs as the policies relate to football programs.			
22	Prep Programs/Prep Teams	Competitive Equity & Sport Structure Committee	CARRIED.

This motion establishes characteristics of a Prep Program. It outlines that student-athletes who participate in a Prep Program are ineligible to compete in BCSS in that sport, including a 12-month ineligibility period after leaving the program, with a limited early-withdrawal exception. The motion also formalizes a process for determining whether a program qualifies as a Prep Program. Overall, the intent is to provide clarity to schools and families on identification, eligibility impacts, and decision-making related to Prep Programs.

23	Sport Academies	Competitive Equity & Sport Structure Committee	CARRIED.
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This motion establishes characteristics of Sport Academies, outlining training focus, academic integration, structure, and delivery, while distinguishing them from traditional school sport models. It clarifies eligibility rules, including restrictions for student-athletes who attend academies outside their catchment, along with a 12-month ineligibility period after withdrawal. The motion also identifies exceptions, such as district-based programs where students remain at their home school. A formal process is outlined for determining status. Overall, the intent is to improve clarity, consistency, and fairness in how academies are defined and how eligibility is applied.
