#### **BCSS 2021 Annual General Meeting Results**

The 53rd BCSS Annual General Meeting was held on Saturday May 1st, 2021. 295 member schools of the 375 eligible voters (78.6%) cast a ballot. It is important to note that a school could abstain from any particular motion, while stubmitting a ballot, so the number on each motion may differ slightly.

### Governance Proposal

The Special Resolution on the new governance proposal was carried by a vote of 212 for to 77 against (73.4%).

Thank you to everyone who participated in the governance process over the past 2+ years. The office has already begun reaching out to zones, commissioners and other stakeholders to start putting the pieces into place for the transition to the new model.



#### **BCSS Esports Trial Season**

Over the past 30 years Sue Thorn has been a Local Association President, Zone President, Board Member and Committee members, many of which she has held consecutively for more than 20 years.
